Be Careful What You Wish For

Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32

Wouldn't it be wonderful if all our wishes would come true? We might think so, but sometimes what we wish for isn't always good for us. That's what a young man found out in today's Bible story.

In today's story, there was a young man who had three wishes.

1. He wanted lots of money.
2. He wanted to travel and see the world.
3. He wanted to be his own boss. No one telling him what to do.

The young man went to his father to ask for his inheritance now, instead of when his father passed. Even though the father was sad to see his son go, he gave him what he wanted. The young man left home and traveled to many lands. He visited all the places he wanted to and did whatever he wanted to do. He was happy no one was telling him what to do. If he saw something he wanted, he would buy it. Since he had lots of money, why not? Also with all his money he made lots of friends.

This sounds like a pretty good story. But, hold on. That isn't the end of the story. After awhile he ran out of money and when this happened his friends didn't want to be around him anymore. At this point he was so desperate he went to work for a man who hired him to feed the pigs. As he looked at the messy pigs in their messy pen, he thought about the mess he made of his life. He thought about his father and the home he left behind and began to miss them.

The young man said to himself, " Even the servants in my father's house live better than this. What I will do is return to my father, tell him I'm sorry for the way I behaved and ask him to give me a job as one of his servants", so he headed home.

How to start your craft sticks



How to finish your craft sticks




3 Samples

Materials:

- 9 craft sticks
- 1 button or other item to use as doorknob.
- Template signs (your choice), or make your own.
- Scissors
- Tacky glue or hot glue
- Yarn or ribbon to hang
- Decorations (optional)
- Paint or stain, Paint brush, Cloth (optional)

Directions:

- Cut ends off 4 craft sticks with adult scissors.
- Paint or stain all craft sticks-rub with cloth if stained before it dries (optional)...let dry.
- Place 2 of the 4 just cut craft sticks horizontally a distance apart to glue 5 craft sticks on.
- Glue the 5 craft sticks vertically side by side to the horizontal ones.
- Glue last 2 cut craft sticks horizontally across vertical ones matching placement at the same level to the first horizontal craft sticks.
- Set aside to dry.
- Print and cut out templates (or make your own).
- Decorate 'door' (optional)
- Glue template signs or your own on 'door' or hang them at the bottom of the 'door'.
- Glue button or other item on 'door' for the doorknob.
- Cut yarn or ribbon long enough to use for hanging.
- Glue yarn or ribbon to the back of 'door' or tie at top of 'door'.
- It's now ready to hang.
