

THE BIRTH OF ISHMAEL

Old Testament Lesson #11

Abram and Sarai (SA-ri) had lived for 10 years in the land of Canaan, and they still had no children. God had promised that Abram would have children, more than the stars of heaven or the dust of the earth, so Sarai thought maybe Abram could have a family through her maid. She offered her Egyptian maidservant named Hagar (HA-gar) to Abram. Abram agreed to Sarai's plan for him to take Hagar as a wife. Soon Hagar became pregnant.

As soon as Hagar knew she was pregnant, she scorned Sarai, and Sarai was miserable. Abram told Sarai that since Hagar was her servant, Sarai should do whatever she wanted with her. Sarai treated Hagar badly, and Hagar ran away to the desert.

An angel of the LORD found Hagar near a spring on the road that leads to Shur. The angel asked her what she was doing, and she explained she was running away from Sarai. The angel told her to go back to Sarai and submit to her. The angel promised that God would multiply her descendants so that there would be too many to count. Her child would be a son whom she should name "Ishmael (ISH-ma-el)." The angel explained that the child would be "a wild donkey of a man; his hand will be against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he will live in hostility toward all his brothers."

Hagar called the LORD, "You are the God who sees me."

Hagar did as the angel said. In time, she gave birth to Ishmael. Abram was 86 years old when this happened.

POINTS TO CONSIDER:

- Abram was 75 when he left Haran (Genesis 12:4) and was promised a son from his own body (Genesis 13:14-16; 15:4-6). Ishmael was born when Abram was 86 (Genesis 16:16).
- In Galatians 4:21-31, the apostle Paul uses the story of Hagar as an allegory, where Hagar represents the old covenant.
- "Ishmael" means "God hears."
- Many people regard the Arabs as the descendants of Ishmael. Mohammed, the founder of Islam, claimed descent from Ishmael.
- The prediction that Hagar's child would be "a wild donkey of a man" possibly referred to the proud spirit he would possess.




- I. Abram and Sarai continued to wait for children to be born.




