

JACOB'S BARGAIN WITH LABAN

Old Testament Lesson #23

After the birth of Jacob's 11th son, Joseph, Jacob asked Laban's permission to return to his homeland. He had already served Laban for 14 years (seven years before his marriages to Leah and Rachel and seven afterward). Laban asked Jacob to please stay. Laban understood that God had blessed him because Jacob was working for him. He asked Jacob what wages would persuade him to stay.

Jacob replied that Laban did not have to pay him anything, but he would continue tending the flocks if Laban would agree to give Jacob any sheep or goat that was spotted, speckled or dark-colored. Laban would keep the solid-colored ones.

The same day Laban agreed to Jacob's terms, Laban went through the flock and removed all the males that were speckled or spotted or dark-colored. Without the speckled animals, it would be nearly impossible for speckled or spotted offspring to be conceived. Laban put these animals in the care of his sons and separated them from the rest of his flock by a distance of three days' journey.

Despite Laban's efforts, God was with Jacob and blessed him and caused speckled and spotted animals to be born. Jacob wisely managed Laban's flock, working so that only the strongest sheep and goats were bred to produce speckled or spotted offspring. He continued to separate the animals, the weak from the strong, with the weaker ones going to Laban and the stronger ones to himself.

In this manner, Jacob "grew exceedingly prosperous and came to own large flocks." He also acquired camels and donkeys and had many servants. Yet, Jacob never forgot that it was through the hand of God that these blessings and successes came (see Genesis 31:4-13).

POINTS TO CONSIDER:

- Jacob learned some valuable lessons through all the deceptions of Laban. He learned to trust in God and in the promises God had made. He did not complain or seek to get around what Laban did but rather trusted God and continued to work diligently at his job. This allowed God to bless him so that he became quite prosperous. It helped teach Jacob not to take matters into his own hands (as he and Rebekah had done in stealing the blessing from Esau) but to trust God's promises.

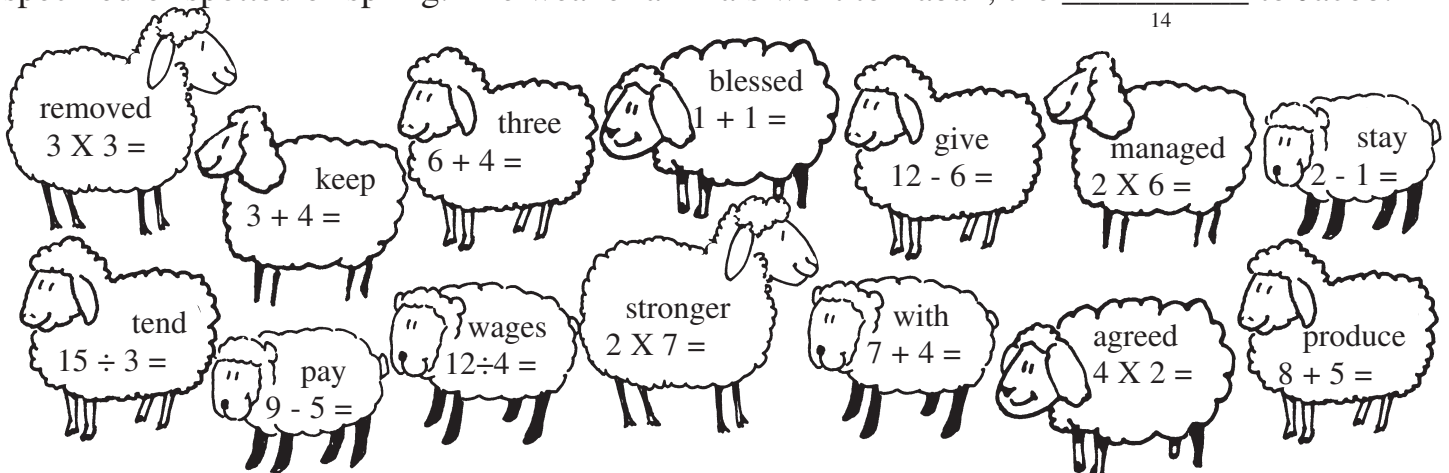

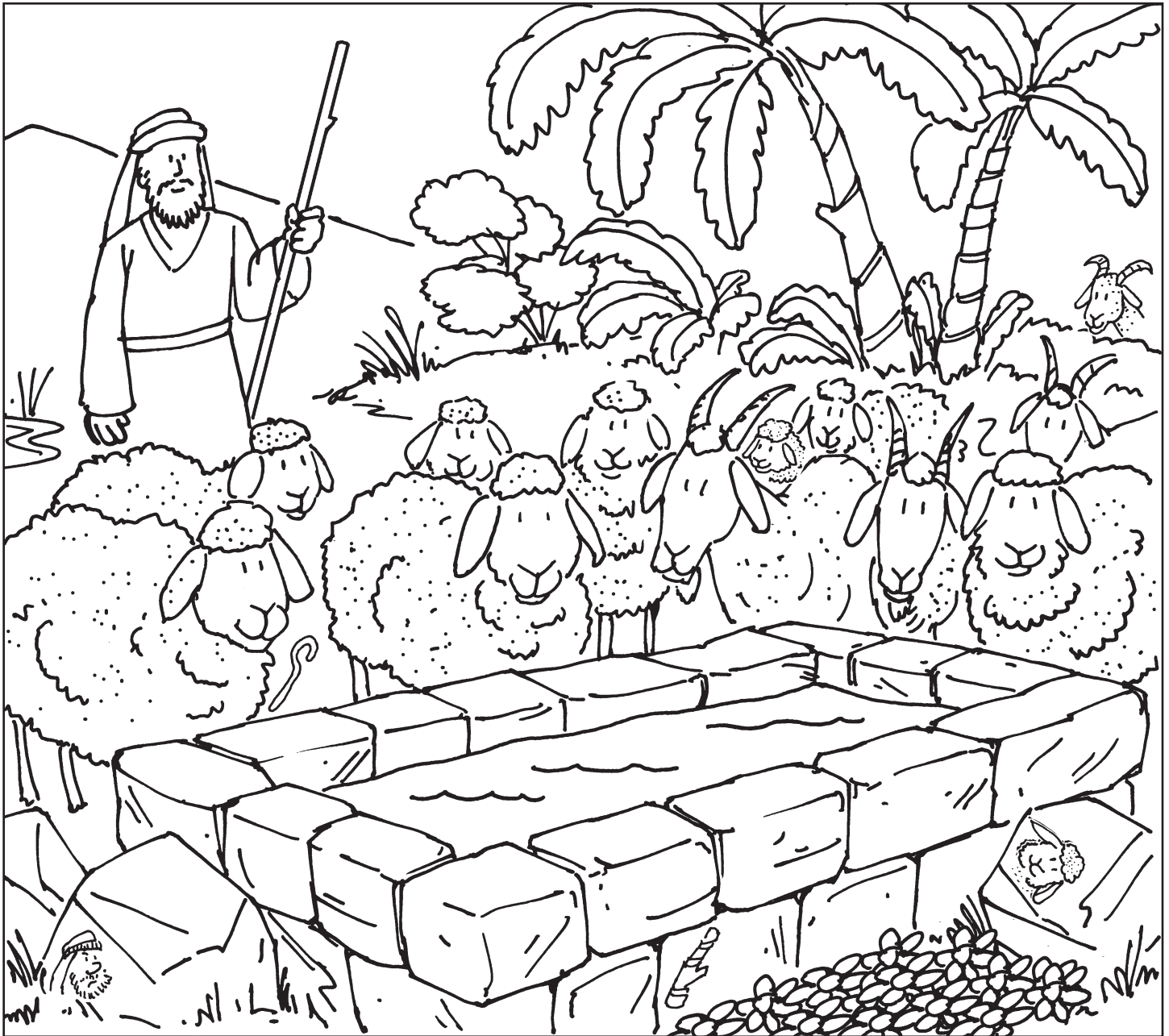
