

GOOD MEN AND WOMEN

Old Testament Lesson #52

Job (JOBE) is described as a man who was "blameless and upright, one who feared God and turned away from evil." He was ever conscious of God. He is referred to throughout the Bible as a righteous man. In Ezekiel, he is named along with Noah and Daniel as men who were righteous before God (Ezekiel14:14,20), and in the book of James, he is praised for his patience (James 5:10-11). Job was a man who trusted God in spite of all the bad things that had happened to him.

The woman of Proverbs 31 demonstrates a character that is pleasing to God. She is said to be worth more than rubies. Her husband trusts her, and she does him good and not harm as long as she lives.

She:

- works with her hands in wool and flax.
- brings her family food from far away.
- rises while it is still night to make food for her family and servant girls.
- looks at a field and buys it.
- plants a vineyard with the money she has earned.
- is a hard worker.
- knows the value of what she makes.
- works late into the night.
- is generous to the needy.
- takes good care of her family.
- makes coverings for her bed.
- is clothed well herself.
- makes linen garments and sells them.
- watches over the affairs of her household and is not idle.
- is dignified and strong, speaks with wisdom, and her family praises her.
- is not afraid of the future.

This passage ends with the proverb, "Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised."


POINTS TO CONSIDER:
